for Spotting Fake News & Information on the Internet



- 1 Information that comes from a source no one has heard of before could be fake.
- 2 Fake information often contains lots of mistakes in spelling and grammar.
- 3 Fake news tends to make sensational and outrageous claims about famous people.
- 4 Trusted news reports include the name of the journalist and the date of the post.

- Fake news often includes old photographs from events that are not connected with the current report.
 - Fake information sites may contain links and downloads that will send viruses and malware to a user's computer.
- Fake information sites may try to persuade a user to hand over personal information which is then used for annoying advertising or even for criminal purposes.
- Fake news uses almost unbelievable headlines to gain a reader's attention.
 The content may actually have little connection with the meaning of the headline.
- If no other reliable Internet source is reporting the same information, this suggests that the original report may be fake.
- 10 Fake information does not offer any proof for its claims.
